Introductions of all on the committee were made and we welcomed our new members.

3. Fundraisers:

Thoughts on Boosterthon Fundraiser?

We discussed the advantages and disadvantages with have the Boosterthon Company come and run the event. Our PTA earned 58% of the money donated which ended up at \$16,000. We were happy with the figure and felt it was worth having someone else do all the work.

4. Trust Land Money discussion:

We are implementing our goals for this year as follows:

Literacy

70% of students will show 'typical' (or higher) progress on DIBELS Pathways to Progress on middle of year DIBELS (\$55,500 – Tutors and Summer Library).

STEM

Students will earn a school wide median growth percentile of 55 in math (\$39,979- Subs for PD, Faculty book, Software, Cloud books & iPads).

Teaching for Learning

The percentage of behavioral expectations being clearly and consistently applied will increase by two percent. (Indicator #34- \$5,000 – Subs for faculty and staff that plan PD, Supplies, Behavior Plan tracking software).

The Trust Land Report has been submitted for approval (annual accounting) regarding the SIP last year. As soon as it is approved it will be online.

Mrs. Merkley explained each of the goals for this school year and mentioned that all the money for cloud books and iPads had already been spent. We have new equipment this year from Trust Land Funds and the "Refresh" money the district gives to schools yearly to upgrade/maintain computers, cloud books and iPads. It was brought to our attention that many cloud books on the 5th grade cart are having battery issues. Mrs. Merkley will talk with her STS about this.

Mrs. Merkley mentioned that the district is looking into putting a fence up in between the two parking lots (city and school property lines) and having a speed bump with a crosswalk on top (5 ft wide) on the corner of the drop off area. Jordan Savage brought up the idea of having a gate replace where the barricades are for emergencies. Mrs. Merkley will talk further with the district on this issue.

Jordan Savage also explained to the committee why a hawk light and a speed limit zone cannot coexist. Discussion was also made about “visual friction” and the distraction it could be for drivers.

Lockout Drill Today!

A lockout means all doors are locked and no one is let in or out of the building. School continues as normal.

A lockout is called when there is a threat or hazard outside the school building or somewhere in the neighborhood. Typically, law enforcement or another emergency agency asks the school to go into a lockout.

Lockout procedure:

- Lock all exterior doors to the school to keep threat out of the school.

- • Call 911 to notify that your school is in a lockdown (do not call 911 if lockdown was initiated by the police department).
- • Administrators call security 801-402-7680 and notify them that the school is in lockdown. Security will notify district administrators.
- • Monitor doors.
- • Work with District personnel and Police until the problem is resolved.

Student Procedures

A lockdown means all doors are locked and no one is let in or out of the building. School continues as normal.

A lockdown is called when there is a threat or hazard outside the school building or somewhere in the neighborhood. Typically, law enforcement or another emergency agency asks the school to go into a lockdown.

- • Go back inside the school
- • Return to class or go to the office
- • Report anything suspicious

School safety is everyone's responsibility! To accomplish this students and teachers need to work together to identify, report and keep our schools safe. This is accomplished through three primary actions.

- • See Something – Is it out of the ordinary?
- • Say Something – Report what you see to a teacher or administrator
- • Send It – Submit a tip to the Safe UT App with your phone

2. Citizen Comments:
